Dear Parents & Carers

It has been another exciting week at the school and the children continue to thrive and progress. There have been two successful sports events and many of the children are preparing for their summer music concert.

Athletics – On Monday 25 children from Year 5 and 6 represented the school in various athletic events. Despite the chilly June weather, it was a fantastic event where everyone enjoyed themselves and many excelled. The sprints and relays were particularly competitive and every child tried their best. Newnham came 3rd overall and I'm sure all of the children appreciated the time Mrs Nuth put in to training them.

Cricket – Following on from last week's Girls' Cricket the boys attended their tournament on Wednesday, determined to equal their success. We had 3 teams entered, showing how cricket has really taken off at the school. The C team enjoyed their day and improved in every match. The B team progressed through the group stage, and won a very tense quarter final against Breakspear. The A team also topped their group and beat Oak Farm in the quarter final, scoring 103 runs in 8 overs. The teams met in the semi-final which was a very close affair with the A team narrowly edging it. The A team moved on to win the final, meaning that as Borough champions they join the girls at the London Youth Games next week. All the boys have worked really hard this year in developing their cricket skills and it has really paid off. It is quite an achievement to have a 1st and 3rd placed team at a borough final.

C team football – On the same day as the cricket a number of boys attended at tournament at Harlyn School for Year 6 children who do not play football at a grass roots. We also took a few children to referee. This was a fantastic event and all of the children were proud to represent the school. They thoroughly enjoyed themselves and Mr Kent was very impressed with their skill level.

Household Support Fund - Hillingdon Council – The free school meal program is funded by the Household Support Grant and the current grant was extended from April - September 2024 meaning that that they can continue to support those families with children attending a Hillingdon School, who are in receipt of benefit related free school meals during the six weeks school summer holiday 2024 with food vouchers. The school summer holiday vouchers will be issued in two payments, the first payment will be emailed week commencing 22nd July and will cover the first 3 weeks, the second payment will be emailed week commencing 12th August covering the last 3 weeks. All children in receipt of benefit related free school meal as of 9th July will be eligible for the school summer holiday food vouchers. This will be the final payment from the current Household Support Grant there are no further payments scheduled after the school summer holidays 2024.
